To celebrate this milestone, Woosh hosted a special diaper-themed event today at daycare center Stampertje in Bruges.

The give-back diaper is an innovative and recyclable diaper developed by Woosh. After use, the diapers are collected and recycled, ensuring that valuable materials are repurposed. This process significantly reduces the amount of disposable diaper waste. # New Recycling Hub in Bruges

Woosh recently inaugurated a state-of-the-art R&D and recycling hub on the grounds of the inter-municipal waste organization IVBO in Bruges. Thousands of used Woosh diapers are now processed daily, resulting in a significant reduction in diaper waste. Through an ingenious recycling process, materials from the diapers are repurposed into new, valuable products.

"As a result of recycling our give-back diapers, we prevent 2,000 tons of diapers—equivalent to 200,000 garbage bags—from ending up in landfills annually," says CTO Alby Roseveare. "But this is just the beginning. Our dream is a world without diaper waste, and we're working towards that goal every single day."

#### Now Available for Individual Customers

Although Woosh has mainly focused on daycare centers so far, individual customers can also order the give-back diapers through the webshop and have them delivered to their home or to a participating daycare center. "Our next mission is to establish give-back points across Belgium, making it easy for all parents to return their Woosh diapers," adds Stubbe.

## Collaboration with Strong Partners

The development of the first give-back diaper was made possible through close collaboration with various partners. Diaper manufacturer Ontex played a pivotal role in designing the product, prioritizing both eco-friendliness and user convenience.
